



Faculty Position in Biomedical Biology

The applicants are expected to contribute to our B.Sc., M.Sc. and Ph.D. programs and to educational and research excellence in the area of Biomedical Sciences at Laurentian, helping to further develop the Francophone curricula in this field. The successful candidate is expected to teach the following Biology courses in French: BIOL 2026 F Introduction à la microbiologie, BIOL 2126 F Biologie cellulaire, BIOL 3117 F Maladies infectieuses, and other specialized courses in biomedical area, according to the candidate's specialization. The successful candidate will teach primarily in French.
